India has launched one of the world's largest vaccination campaign against measles, a major childhood killer disease, and congenital rubella syndrome (CRS), responsible for irreversible birth defects. The campaign aims to vaccinate more than 35 million children in the age group of nine months to 15 years with MR (measles and rubella) vaccine. It demonstrates India's commitment to improve health and well-being of its people by protecting children against vaccine preventable diseases.

The state government launched the Measles-Rubella vaccination drive across Gujarat. The drive will cover about 1.6 crore children in the age group of 9 months to 15 years, on Monday.

Chief Minister Vijay Rupani launched the drive at a school in Gandhinagar. Speaking on the occasion, Rupani said that school-going children would be covered under the drive in the first two weeks, and those going to anganwadis in the next two. He said that the fifth week will be to vaccinate children who miss out in the first four weeks, "to ensure that no single child remains unvaccinated".

According to officials, the health department has deputed 10,000 people for the vaccination drive, which is a part of the

nation's biggest injectable vaccination drive to be undertaken in 20 states.
